About our Guest Speakers

Dr. Leonard du Preez

MBChB, DA, FCS, FCA, MMed. (Thor.) MMed (Anaes + Critical Care)

Leonard du Preez started his medical training in 1992 and graduated in 1998 from Stellenbosch University. He completed his internship and community service at Uitenhage Provincial Hospital. Following his community service, he completed a Diploma in Anaesthesiology at Livingstone Hospital, followed by 18 months in the United Kingdom. After returning from the UK, he specialised in Cardiothoracic Surgery from 2003-2008 and Anaesthesiology and Critical Care from 2008-2012 at Tygerberg Hospital and Stellenbosch University. Important achievements for the purpose of the SUAS talk:



- Anaesthesia for the first transvenous transtricuspid valve in valve procedure
- While in Surgical practice implemented uniportal VATS lobectomy at Tygerberg Hospital, first case in Africa.
- First successful ECMO run at Panorama Mediclinic

Dr. du Preez is currently in full time anaesthesiology practice in the private sector with sessions at Tygerberg Hospital. His focus is on cardiothoracic anaesthesia, peri-operative pathophysiology of the cardiothoracic surgical patient, minimally invasive approaches combined with enhanced recovery. He is passionate about teamwork in cardiothoracic surgery, safety, outcomes and continuing education.

Professor Elvis Irusen

MB ChB, FCP (SA), Pulmonology, PhD, FCCP Head: Division of Pulmonology and Critical Care Division

Professor Irusen trained in research at the Royal Brompton Hospital and at Imperial College in London. He worked in molecular immunology and biology as related to asthmatic inflammation, which culminated in his PhD.

He is a past-president of the SA Thoracic Society and SA representative on GOLD (Global Initiative for Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease: 2010- 2018). The European Respiratory Society and the Allergy Society



of South Africa have given distinguished service awards to him. He has received the prestigious Rector's Excellence in Community Service award and several Annual Service Awards for research and teaching.

He serves as reviewer for a number of esteemed respiratory journals & has been involved in the development of numerous guidelines and has over 100 publications. His research interests are in epidemiology and clinical and molecular aspects of respiratory medicine, particularly asthma and COPD.
